

Section Chief Harrison Fry opened the COC at 11:40 asking that everyone present return to their seats.

Harrison then spoke about Conclave Registration being opened on Jan. 2<sup>nd</sup>, due to the first being a Sunday. Harrison then moved on to the Conclave patch that was approved at the previous COC.

Then at 11:42 Harrison invited Section Vice Chief Zach Callicutt to speak about NEXT and PRISM. Zach informed everyone that the two national events were very informative and fun.

After Zach, Harrison informed the COC that the Section Officers went to Alabama for the yearly SOS. He said that a major part of what happened at SOS was LINK. He told the COC that LINK is what was taught in the SLS earlier that morning. He then moved onto the upcoming national events: OAHA, NLS, DLYC, and Operation Arrow. He asked that each lodge take a few minutes and discuss the expected amount of people they would have attend each event.

After the Lodges gave their reports, at 12:05, the Service Lodge Chairman Sid Salazar went over his report. He explained that they were hoping for one thousand participants at this year's Conclave. He also told the COC that the Conclave would be "BYOT" (Bring Your Own Tent) and that all non-service lodge participants would be housed in the Stahlman Activity field. [See PowerPoint] After his presentation, we went on a tour of Boxwell.

At 1:30 we moved onto the Promotions report. In the Absence of David Thornton, Sid gave his report. He explained that the Promotions committee has a plan to work with the Section Secretary on getting different promotional materials out on the Section website and Facebook page. [See PowerPoint]

After promotions at 1:37, Vice Chief Zach Callicutt began the Section Trading Post report by first asking what everyone would like to see in the trading post this year. Many ideas were thrown out, a few were: Phone cases, luggage tags, bandanas, water bottles, hats, toothpick holders, credit card holders, lapel pins, hoodies, sweatpants, and Patagonia-type vest. A suggestion was that the Trading Post have small enough sizes for all of the younger Arrowmen.

At 1:44 after Zach, Sid Salazar presented the Special Events report since Sims Bell was unable to be at the COC. He began by saying that the main importance for the Special Events Committee was that no Arrowman at Conclave would be bored. [See PowerPoint]

Caleb McCulley started his presentation over the Train Committee at 1:59. He began by stating the budget was increased to 1300\$ in order to purchase patches. He also explained that the Schedule was being revamped in order to provide more training output. [See PowerPoint]

At 2:02, Joshua Waffird began his PowerPoint over the Campfire Committee by stating the main part of the 900\$ budget was to be spent on a fireworks display, put on by the local fire department, at the closing campfire.

At 2:07, Brent Gass presented his report over ceremonies. He said that this year was going to be similar to last years ceremonies since it did well last year. [See PowerPoint]

Ben Gilbert presented the Quest report at 2:10. His plans for this year are to have two different parts of Quest. One part would be the original quest games and the other being "Heat" events or "Scouting Skills" games.

After Ben at 2:15, Tristan Fox began his report on the AIE Committee. He explained that a drum and dance team would be brought in to hopefully increase the attendance of AIE.

At 2:18, Paylor Eubank Section Secretary spoke to the COC about the publications for this year. He explained that his hopes are to have a Committee in place to help with newsletters and other publications that will be published throughout the year.

Harrison discussed the Conclave fee proposal, sharing the news that the fees will be (\$40 for early registration, \$45 for regular registration, \$55 for late/walk-on registration). He called for a motion to approve these fees. The motion was made by Ahoalan Nachpikin, seconded by Kawida, and passed unanimously.

After a round of applause for setting the Conclave fee, Associate Section Adviser Rick Robinson gave the Advisers minute since Jim Cheatham was unable to attend the COC.

At 3:13, the COC circled up and sang the song of the Order and the meeting was adjourned.
