These are some of the great things that come out of communicating with your Lodge, the Section and even your Chapters.




I hope that everyone will come up with their own ideas of what we should do at these events to be better. But we can't make them happen until you tell us what they are- please come to us with any suggestions.

In July the Order had its annual National Order of


